


Hospitalization Alerts	Alert is presented as a number from 0-5. Research shows that a score greater than zero suggests the Client has a 40% chance of being hospitalized in the next six months for a behavioral health issue. Higher numbers (up to 5) are associated with risk of hospitalization sooner rather than later.	On the first page of the Client Report.
